HOPE 2021 & ACADEMIC ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION – MAY 2021

The Annual academic prize distribution along with the cultural fest **HOPE** of all self-financed courses of Lala Lajpatrai College of Commerce & Economics was held online on Saturday 22nd May 2021 via Zoom Platform keeping in mind the pandemic protocols. It was first of its kind where the entire event of academic prize distribution and non-academic events as well as its prize distributions was organized online using a virtual platform. The event of academic prize distribution was graced by the chief guest **Ms. Shweta Shalini – Young Indian Entrepreneur Social Activist & BJP spokesperson.** Not only that, there were more than 15 teaching staff members and 200 students who witnessed the program. The program was also telecast live on YouTube, which has around 1000 plus views till date.

The program began at sharp 10:00 am with the National Anthem played online. The whole program was very well compered by the very young faculty member of SFC department; Ms. Delaveen Tarapore. The first half of the program had all Non-Academic events — cultural events popularly known as HOPE. The event began with **singing competition** followed by **dance competition**, **playing of instruments** and in between every event **some notable performances of students** were played online in the form of the fillers.

In singing competition there were total 11 participants across all streams. Their prerecorded performances were played as the event was completely online. Followed by singing there were special performances and 3 such performances were played before the beginning of the dance competition.

There were around 9 participants who participated in dance competition from all stream taken together. Even in dance competition; there were pre-recorded dances of these students which were played as a part of their participation. Followed by the dance competition again there were 2 special performances played. The Non-academic cultural event HOPE ended with the last competition **Playing Instrument.** There were 5 participants in Playing Instruments.

The cultural program was ended with **paying tribute to the departed souls** who were part of Lala Lajpatrai family.

The second half of the program was Annual Prize distribution ceremony. Every year The Annual Prize Distribution ceremony is always an occasion to celebrate the achievements of Lalaits who have attained excellence in academic and co-curricular spheres through dedicated hard work and perseverance. Felicitating the achievers not only serves the purpose of motivating them to surpass their own performance but also encourages their

The formal program began with a small video of all students who contributed to the society during this pandemic time in the form of social service.
